Because of the decision to not use St. Andrew's school building this coming fall, a small committee of St Andrew's Administrative Council began a search for possible AFC/parish office options. Places were looked at both in Fairfax and Gibbon. On April 17th, the Administrative Council met, along with the Area Staff, to hear of options and give feedback on them. During the meeting a consensus was reached that the AFC office would be moved to the front (east) office of St. Andrew's rectory and the pastor's office would be the second office from the east. There was some concern that there are steps to get into the office. The Council thought that with a phone call, a parishioner who could not do stairs could request to meet in the church social hall which is handicap accessible. With Fr. Bruno coming at the end of June we need to keep moving ahead with plans for the coming year before he comes. We are asking for volunteers to help move office furniture and other items to the rectory during the second week of June. We will need a trailer to transport things too. Perhaps the same crew could also transfer a few items to the church social hall that will be needed for Religious Education classes.
