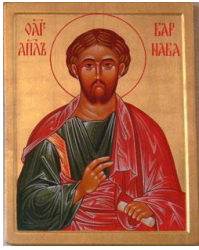

ORDINARY TIME: We now move into “Ordinary Time”. So what is it? Ordinary Time is the period in the Church calendar outside of other major seasons, and runs 33 or 34 weeks. In Latin, Ordinary Time is called Tempus Per Annum (“time throughout the year”). The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ. It is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. In these next weeks and months may we commit ourselves to find ways to grow in the life of Christ by reflecting on his call to live as he did.



KNOW A SAINT: Barnabas (11)

All we know of Barnabas is to be found in the New Testament. A Jew, born in Cyprus and named Joseph, he with the earliest converts to Christianity in Jerusalem. He persuaded the community there to accept Paul as a disciple, was sent to Antioch, Syria, to look into the community there, and brought Paul there from Tarsus. With Paul he brought Antioch's donation to the Jerusalem community during a famine, and returned to Antioch with John Mark, his cousin. The three went on a missionary journey to Cyprus and Antioch in Pisidia, where they were so violently opposed by the Jews that they decided to preach to the pagans. Then they went on to Iconium and Lystra in Lycaonia, where they were first acclaimed gods and then stoned out of the city, and then returned to Antioch in Syria. When a dispute arose regarding the observance of the Jewish rites, Paul and Barnabas went

to Jerusalem, where, at a council, it was decided that pagans did not have to be circumcised to be baptized. On their return to Antioch, Barnabas wanted to take John Mark on another visitation to the cities where they had preached, but Paul objected because of John Mark's desertion of them in Perga. Paul and Barnabas parted, and Barnabas returned to Cyprus with Mark; nothing further is heard of him, though it is believed his rift with Paul was ultimately healed. Tradition has Barnabas preaching in Alexandria and Rome, the founder of the Cypriote Church, the Bishop of Milan (which he was not), and has him stoned to death at Salamis about the year 61. His feast day is June 11.

1. **Opening Prayer and Enrichment:** S. Mary Ann lead prayer, Enrichment on Exhortation by Pope Francis, five simple points to live by.
2. **Welcome** to Rose Forst!
3. **Diocesan Survey:** This is on hold now. Bankruptcy court would not allow this extra spending.
4. **Area Weekend Mass Schedule:** The schedule was reviewed again. Father will send out with a letter to all parishioners.
5. **Pictorial Directory/Lifetouch:** Father talking with Jacob from Lifetouch. Local committees are organizing by email. Schedule is set for August and September.

8. **Meetings for Next Fiscal Year 2018-2019:** Meetings on third Tuesday, August 21, 2018, at Franklin; November 20, 2018, at Winthrop; February 19, 2019, at Gibbon; May 21, 2019, at Fairfax. Meeting starts at 6:30.
9. **New members** and terms were reviewed.
10. **Transition:** Fr. Bruno Santiago starts June 26, 2018, at noon. We need to set AFC budget and do parish budgets.
