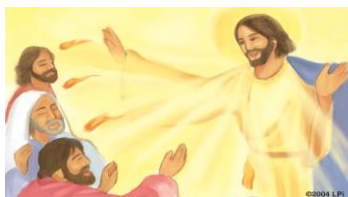

Jesus breathes on the disciples to indicate the conferring of the Holy Spirit. Here we see the origin of power over sin, the Sacrament of Penance. This shows the power of the Holy Spirit in the hearts of human beings.

How manifold are your works, O LORD,” proclaims the psalmist in today’s response to the first reading. Indeed, the diversity of God’s blessing is seen in the works of creation. A simple walk through the produce section in any grocery store reveals just the tip of the iceberg of the diversity of God’s gifts. Even more wondrous is humankind – men and women created in God’s image and yet each reflecting some aspect of the divine. Here is the Spirit at work! Here is the earth full of all whom God created! This is the Spirit at work.

Lord Jesus, thank you for the wonderful gift of your Holy Spirit!”

PENTECOST is about more than what God has given you. It’s also about how God is sending you. Jesus told his disciples, “As the Father has sent me, so I send you” (John 20:21). So, if the Father sent Jesus out with the Spirit, he is sending you the same way.

CALL TO ACTION:

“World Oceans Day” (6/8) - On World Oceans Day, people around our blue planet celebrate and honor the ocean, which connects us all. 70% of our beautiful “blue planet” Earth is ocean which provides our lives with seafood, oxygen, transportation and beauty. However, the capacity of oceans to nourish life is being seriously undermined by human created pollution - especially plastic pollution. About 8 million tons of plastic are thrown into the ocean annually; every minute, one garbage truck of plastic is dumped into the ocean; by 2050 there will be more plastic in the oceans than there are fish (by weight). What can you do to improve the bodies of water in our area?

“World Day Against Child Labor” (6/12) - This year’s theme is, *Children shouldn’t work in fields, but on dreams.* Currently some 152 million children are working instead of attending school. Although child labor occurs in almost every sector, seven out of every ten is in agriculture. On this day, we are reminded of the UN Sustainable Development Goal #8 which calls on the international community to put an end to child labor in all its forms by 2025. Celebrate the joy and gift of children in some way this week!
