In the experience of the church the Epiphany mystery includes the manifestations of Christ as he was revealed to the nations. Three mysteries are celebrated, something that we will do over three Sundays this year. The first is the manifestation of the newborn king to the Magi from the East, today's celebration. The second is the baptism of the Lord, celebrated next weekend, when Jesus began his public ministry. And the third this year we will hear the Gospel of the wedding feast at Cana, the first miracle in which Jesus revealed himself to his disciples, and they came to believe in him. All these mysteries are celebrated in the Epiphany, Christ is revealed. He is made known. For us, the Epiphany, like all of Christmas, is not to be left in the past. The revelation of Christ is to be made known today. And we are the ones called to reveal him to others.
