"Repent and believe in the Gospel." What would happen if Jesus spoke these commanding words today? Would his listeners accuse him of shoving his religion down their throats? Would they insist that repentance is an outdated idea from a bygone era obsessed with guilt? How many of us would actually listen to him, and do what he said? Our modern culture has been programmed to respond with skepticism, if not anger, to any suggestion that there is a "right" way of doing things or a "true" religion. But when Jesus tells us to repent, he implies that some of the choices we are making are wrong, that we need to change, to eliminate our sins. To turn toward God, and to become more loving, more generous, and more forgiving. And when he tells us to believe in the Gospel, he's not just making a recommendation. He is giving us directions for entering "the Kingdom of God." He wants us to share in the glory of his kingdom, now and for all eternity.

"Lord Jesus, change us by your word, and make us one so that the world might believe."

God gives to us freely. What he wants in return is for us to **know him**, the reward is beyond our dreams. **Love him**, seeking Communion with him often. **Serve him**, when we make sure everyone has enough to eat, warm clothes to wear and a place to stay.

KNOW A SAINT - St. Agnes (January 24)

St. Agnes of Rome was born in 291 AD and raised in a Christian family. Agnes was very beautiful and belonged to a wealthy family. For this reason many young men wanted to marry her. Whenever a man wished to marry Agnes, she would always say, "Jesus Christ is my only Spouse." One of those she refused was the Governor's son. He tried to win her for his wife with rich gifts and promises, but she kept saying, "I am already promised to the Lord of the Universe". He then reported her for being a Christian. She was arrested and sent to a house of prostitution but an angel protected her. She was then condemned to death and is buried near Rome. St. Agnes is widely known as the patron saint of young girls, chastity and rape survivors. She is often represented with a lamb, the symbol of her innocence.

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK WILL BE CELEBRATED THE WEEK OF JANUARY 31 THROUGH FEBRUARY 6. In conjunction with that significant event, Bishop LeVoir historically announced that a second collection would be taken up at all Masses in the diocese the last weekend in January to benefit Catholic schools in the Diocese of New Ulm. In the past, this collection, along with the annual Brunch with the Bishop event, supported our Catholic Schools Endowment. Since we will be unable to host a Brunch with the Bishop this year, we ask for a special effort with this collection.

In those area faith communities that have Catholic schools, 75 percent of the proceeds will go directly to those Catholic schools. The other 25 percent will be deposited equally in two endowment funds already set up to benefit Catholic schools. Where there are no schools, 100 percent of the funds will go into the endowment funds. The two funds are the Bishop John M. LeVoir Catholic School Endowment Fund (proceeds benefit all Catholic schools in the diocese based on enrollment) and the Bishop John C. Nienstedt Catholic School Scholarship Fund (proceeds benefit students who cannot afford tuition). Please promote and support this important second collection on January 30 and 31.

Prayer of St. Gertrude the Great
