Reflection meditation:

The other day, someone observed the town of Arlington, MN, already views itself as a suburb to the suburbs for the Cities. To the question, when will Winthrop, Gibbon, and Fairfax be suburbs to the suburbs? One person said, "that will be a long time." Someone else said, "There are already people who make that drive." Another said, "the traffic on Highways 19 and 212 has gone up in the last 30 years." People nodded their heads. Maybe the conversation was changing minds about what the future holds for our towns. In Matthew 21:28-32, Jesus asks what does it take to change your mind? The chief priests and elders have what psychologists call a fixed mindset. A fixed mindset is locked in, refuses new data, is unable to adapt, can be defensive instead of open, and often misses what is obvious. Jesus reminds them they rejected the new information John the Baptist preached "in the way of righteousness." These leaders have a fixed mindset instead of a growth mindset. John the Baptist said, "The Kingdom of God is at hand" (Matthew 3:2), and "Behold, the Lamb of God" referring to Jesus (John 1:29). The king said, off with his head (Matthew 14:10, Mark 6:27, Luke 9:9). In Matthew's Gospel, the son who says, "I will not" serve in the vineyard, changes his mind "and went." He has the growth mindset Jesus looks for in his disciples. A growth mindset is open to new information, willing to adapt, is coachable, and capable of seeing the obvious. Do you have a fixed or growth mindset? About the future of Winthrop, Gibbon, and Fairfax? About whom can get to heaven? About what you're willing to do for Jesus? About a human fetus' right to life? As a disciple of Jesus, you can ask him to help you develop a growth mindset this week.

An Overview of Domestic Violence

Domestic violence is any kind of behavior that a person uses to control an intimate partner through fear and intimidation. It includes physical, sexual, psychological, verbal, and economic abuse. Some examples of domestic abuse include battering, name-calling and insults, threats to kill or harm one's partner or children, destruction of property, marital rape, and forced sterilization or abortion. Domestic violence is often shrouded in silence. People outside the family hesitate to interfere, even when they suspect abuse is occurring. Many times even extended family denies that abuse exists, out of loyalty to the abuser and in order to protect the image of the family. Some people still argue—mistakenly—that intervention by outside sources endangers the sanctity of the home. Yet abuse and assault are no less serious when they occur within a family. Even when domestic violence is reported, sometimes there are failures to protect victims adequately or to punish perpetrators.

Mary Hasson, JD

Mary Hasson, JD, is the Kate O'Beirne Fellow at the Ethics and Public Policy Center in Washington, D.C. She is a co-founder and Director of the Person and Identity Project and leads the Catholic Women's Forum, a network of Catholic professional women and scholars amplifying the voices of women in support of Catholic teachings. An attorney and policy expert, Mary advises legislators and faith-based organizations, writes for various publications, speaks at national conferences and universities, and is a frequent media commentator. Mary has been a keynote speaker for the Holy See at the United Nations during the annual U.N. Commission on the Status of Women from 2017-2019, speaking on women and work, the value of caregiving, education, and gender ideology. She also serves as a Consultant for the USCCB Committee on Laity, Marriage, Family Life, and Youth. Mary is the co-author of two books on education and editor of Promise and Challenge: Catholic Women Reflect on Feminism, Complementarity, and the Church. A graduate of the University of Notre Dame and Notre Dame Law School, Mary and her husband are the parents of seven adult children.
