AT THIS TIME, GIVEN THE HIGH RATE OF TRANSMISSION according to the CDC and the MN Department of Health, the diocese suggest the following COVID-19 best practices:

- It is strongly suggested that all ministers of Holy Communion wear masks during distribution of Holy Communion.
- No sign of peace.
- Funeral receptions are permitted following the advice of the local funeral director.
- A priest with a respiratory infection of any kind should avoid celebrating public Masses or administering sacraments. The same holds for other liturgical ministers (deacons, servers, lectors, cantors).
- Food should be plated or served at table or the end of the serving line.
- Parish/AFC Youth Ministry overnight events are discouraged.

The wearing of facemasks is recommended. All members of the faithful, who are able to receive the Covid-19 vaccine safely, are asked to do so. All persons, vaccinated or unvaccinated, should do theirutmost to avoid transmitting the virus.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

World Mission Sunday – the annual, worldwide Eucharistic celebration for the Missions of the Church – will be on October 24 this year. This important day in the life of the Church universal fortifies our understanding of our shared call to mission, bestowed upon us at Baptism.

Pope Francis' message for World Mission Sunday reflects on the theme: "We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20).
