Reflection meditation:

Ask any old timers in a Central and Western Minnesota town and they can still tell you where the blacksmith shop used to be. Before metal welders, machinists and the hydraulic professions, the blacksmith worked metal as far back as 500 years before Christ when Greek and Roman metal workers would turn bronze, copper, silver, and gold into official coins. From the time of the first Roman emperor, Augustus Caesar (27BC – 14AD), adopted son of Julius Caesar, coins like the one below were stamped with the image of the emperor. This is what Jesus is talking about when he says, “repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God,” Matthew 22:15-21.



If this coin is what belongs to Caesar, to the government, to civil authorities, what belongs to God? You belong to God. You are not some coin stamped with a political message. You are a living, breathing person made in the image and likeness of the One, True, and Eternal God. “So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them,” Genesis 1:27. At your baptism you weren’t stamped by a blacksmith. Instead, the imprint of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit was made upon your soul and you received Divine adoption making you “co-heirs’ with Christ and worthy of obtaining “the promised inheritance of eternal life,” Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph #2009. On this World Mission Sunday, remember you are the focus of Jesus Christ’s mission on earth. You belong to God!
