In today's Gospel, Jesus sheds light on the nature of Christian marriage. The Pharisees were trying to trick him, but Jesus transformed their plot into a teachable moment. Speaking of the Mosaic law that allowed a man to divorce his wife, Jesus indicated that this man-made law was not the standard by which marriage should be understood. Instead, he referred back to the story of Adam and Eve, where we see the first human couple living in a state of perfect harmony and bliss with each other and with God. God's original plan for marriage was part of the joyful paradise in Eden. But sin entered the world, and with it came a rupture in the pristine unity of the man and the woman. Thus, Jesus explains divorce as the result of sin (i.e.," the hardness of your hearts"). But as always, Jesus calls us to transcend the slavery of sin. And more than that, he promises us his own divine help, his grace, and his Spirit to enable us to accomplish what we could not do on our own power.

The month of October is dedicated to the most Holy Rosary. The rosary is a beautiful prayer that helps us meditate on the life of Jesus. I encourage you to pray the rosary as a family, especially during this month.

Throughout the **Respect Life month of October**, we heighten our awareness of how sacred human life is from the moment of conception to death. We live in a society that in many ways supports a culture of death, but the Gospel is clear in calling each of us to promote a culture of life.

KNOW A SAINT Francis Seelos – October 5th

Francis Xavier Seelos was born in Germany in 1819. He was named after St. Francis Xavier, the famous Jesuit missionary. When he was a little boy, Francis' mother asked him what he was going to be when he grew up. He answered by pointing at a picture of his name saint and said, "I'm going to be another St. Francis." Francis took the first steps toward his goal by studying philosophy and theology in a German university. While there he learned about the Redemptorists, an order of priests whose mission was to work with German-speaking immigrants in the United States. He immediately joined the order and sailed for America. He began his studies for the priesthood and was ordained in 1844 in Baltimore, Maryland.

He learned the importance of working among the people as Jesus did. Father Francis was able to speak three languages: German, English, and French. He celebrated the sacraments in all three languages, reaching out to as many people as possible. People came from miles away to celebrate Reconciliation with him because of his kindness and understanding. Through him, people came to know that God would never abandon them. He helped people understand that God's love was greater than the power of sin and evil. When he was assigned to New Orleans he continued to work as a pastor among poor and neglected people especially when an epidemic of yellow fever spread through the city. Worn out from ministering to others he could not fight off the disease. He was only 48 years old when God called him into everlasting life in 1867. He showed the people he served that God is merciful and forgiving. We can honor him by asking for forgiveness from anyone we have harmed and by being merciful to anyone who has hurt us.
