Jesus describes the first commandment – the total love for God – and the second – love for neighbor. The words in Hebrew of the first commandment in today's Gospel are something that every pious Jew knows by heart. It is at the core of Mosaic teaching. There is only one God, and no other commands love, respect, devotion, or worship. The second commandment is one that is inscribed on countless inscriptions as though it were a kind of uncomplicated wisdom passed on from generation to generation. But these are God's law for any who claim to follow Christ, and how we live them has implications for our eternal life.

This feast celebrates all those who have entered heaven, including saints who are formally recognized by the Church (canonized) and those whose sainthood is known only to God. We are challenged to remember that all of us are called to be saints. Holy Mass will be held for the AFC on **Monday**, **November 1 at 5:30 p.m. at St. Willibrord - Gibbon.**

All Souls Day (November 2) commemorates the faithful departed who have not yet reached the perfection of heaven. These feasts remind us that there is a prayerful spiritual communion between those in heaven and those who are being purified in purgatory.

The **Book of Remembrance** is available this month of November for you to include the names of deceased loved ones from any time and place. *May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.*

KNOW A SAINT Bernhard Lichtenberg – November 5th

Bernhard Lichtenberg was a Catholic priest who served the people of Berlin at a time of great crisis. Born in 1875 he was ordained to the priesthood in 1899 and witnessed the growing power of the Nazi party and its persecution of the Jewish people. His faith in Jesus Christ gave him the courage to speak out. Bernhard began to pray publicly for the Jewish people and preached against the injustices he saw the Nazis committing on a daily basis. He even went in person to Nazi officers and officials to protest their actions. At first, the Nazis ignored Father Bernhard's complaints but they grew stronger and to silence him Nazi soldiers arrested him. He was jailed for two years, but he never stopping protesting the evil he believed was destroying Germany. He

was sentenced to the concentration camp at Dachau. Already in poor health he died on the train on the way there. He listened and responded to the voice of his conscience and acted to stop persecution in his country. We can follow Bernhard's example by working to form our consciences so that we will make good choices in life.
