When have I put God in a box? Going forward, what will I do to learn new things about Jesus?

Reflection meditation:

“Come out to meet him!” This is an invitation to meet Christ in a new way, Matthew 25:1-13. At some point, many of us fall into the trap of putting other people in a box. We like labels. We like to think we know exactly who somebody is. Most normal people don't enjoy being around this snooty behavior, but that didn't stop some from doing it to Jesus. Isn't he from little old insignificant Nazareth (Matthew 13:57)? He's just the carpenter's son (Matthew 13:55) they said. These comments were and are designed to diminish Jesus, to make him small, an outcast in a so-called community, and someone unworthy of friendship. When we box someone up, we miss learning more about who they really are. We miss a business opportunity, the chance to gain a skill we didn't have, the adventure of a new friendship. There's also the real risk in missing out on a relationship with Jesus Christ and the gift of eternal life, but Matthew 25:1-13 says, “Come out to meet him!” Jesus never reacts, but always responds by breaking free of the “box” and challenging people to learn and relearn who he actually is. We can learn a lot from Jesus when he chooses to respond instead of reacting. If you think you know all you need to know about Jesus, then you've put him in a box. This week pray to the Holy Spirit that you meet Jesus in a new way.

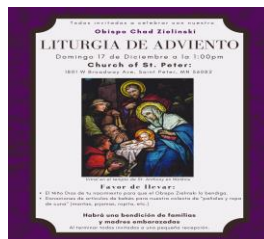
