Reflection meditation:

We give thanks that it is Christ who is King of the Universe. He is the Son of God, not some worldly or political leader. It is God's standard of justice that Matthew 25:31-46 describes, "whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me." Jesus describes those who get pushed aside and are hungry, thirsty, a stranger, naked, ill, in prison, "and you did not care for me." Have you ever gone to an event and found some open seats only to be told "these seats are taken?" If so, you know the feeling of being pushed aside. Has a teacher or coach praised the strengths of a favored student while overlooking your strengths as you stand there? Has an experienced volunteer used heavy handed criticism instead of constructive criticism of a new volunteer only to wonder why they don't see that person anymore? Have you witnessed a leader using words like stupid or worthless around the people they oversee, especially youth, only to see fear in the eyes of those people? We give thanks Jesus uses a God standard, not a human standard. He is looking for a team with some mature self-awareness. Who are smart and don't push others aside. Who offer food, drink, clothing and care. Jesus is looking for Catholics who say, "There's a seat here for you. You have a place at the table." As we prepare for Advent, let us fast from putting people down, from pushing them aside, and rededicate our energies to building them up.

While evangelizing in the area of modern-day Patras, Greece, St. Andrew is arrested by the Roman Empire (around 60-70 AD) and crucified on an X shape cross for his effort to share his faith in Jesus. You can visit his relics/remains at the Cathedral of Saint Andrew, Patras, Greece and at the Cathedral of St. Andrew, in Amalfi, Italy. St. Andrew shines "like the sun in the kingdom" of the Father (Matthew 13:24-43).
