

Jesus instructs his disciples to take an attitude of confidence in the midst of a terribly disturbing situation. Describing his second coming, Jesus says that on seeing this event unfold, "People will die of fright." And yet the disciples are supposed to be pillars of strength. While others tremble in fear, the Lord's followers are somehow immune, with heads raised high. Presumably, because those who follow Christ have nothing to fear. On the contrary, when they have to "stand before the son of Man," it will be a happy occasion. But if we want to be counted among this confident crew, there are a few things for us to do. We have to make sure that "hearts do not become drowsy." Advent is an ideal time to examine our lives to determine what activities, priorities, or pastimes might be putting our hearts to sleep. We need to pray. We need to ask Jesus himself for "the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man". We can't do it alone. But with God's help, we can be true, fearless disciples.

The Feast of St. Andrew is Tuesday, November 30th. We will celebrate our patron saint with Holy Mass at 5:30 p.m. Tuesday evening.

Confession is a sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ in His love and mercy to offer sinners forgiveness for offenses committed against God. We also know this sacrament by the Sacrament of Penance, or Reconciliation. In this sacrament we meet Christ in the person of the priest, ready and eager to absolve us and restore us to new life. Don't let this Advent pass you by without a visit to receive the Lord's Mercy.

FEAST OF THE MIRACULOUS MEDAL – November 27th is the Feast Day of the Miraculous Medal. In 1930, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to St. Catherine Laboure in France and promised that those who wear this medal will receive great graces from Almighty God. The medal was originally called the Medal of the Immaculate Conception, but so many miracles were attributed to it, that it became popularly known as the "Miraculous Medal". The Miraculous Medal is the most widely distributed religious medal in the world and is said to be instrumental in bringing God's grace, miracles of both a physical and spiritual nature, and bringing about conversions to Jesus Christ. In honor of this Feast Day of Our Lady, there are free blessed medals and holy cards (with the story) available in each of the churches in our AFC. Help yourself and give some to friends and family too!
