Reflection meditation:

It's National Vocation Awareness Week. We need more priests. The AFC pays half my salary and the Diocese pays the other half so I can fulfill two missions – our parishes and Director of Vocations for the Diocese. Good priests come from normal parents and families who have chosen to follow Jesus Christ. When you received the Sacrament of Baptism, Jesus Christ made you his disciple and missionary. Your mission is Christ's last commandment, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19-20). Yes, you! Yes, it's your mission! But, how? When we think of missionaries, we think of travelling to distant places where people have never heard the name of Jesus Christ. Your mission is easier than this. Christ needs Catholics who are willing to <u>share the Gospel right at home</u> with the people on your block, in your profession, business, school, team, family, friend-group, hobby-group, card-group, and community organization. I hear, "but that's not what I do Father." My response, read Thessalonians 2:7-9, "We were determined to share with you not only the gospel of God, but our very selves as well, so dearly beloved had you become to us." When we share life with people, we earn the right to share Christ with them. When you go on a fishing trip with your buddies, you earn the right to talk about important things that really matter. If you care enough about the people you spend time with, do you care enough to share Christ's promise of salvation with them? If you feel God is calling you to be a Catholic on mission, this YouTube video by Dr. Ted Sri may encourage you, "The Challenge to Encounter Jesus Christ Daily," https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=cBPocKeToMk.

ST. WILLIBRORD, WHOSE FEAST DAY IS NOVEMBER 7th, lived from around 658 AD to 739 AD. He was born near York, Northumbria, England and died at age 81 in Echternach, Luxembourg. He is the Patron Saint of Luxembourg and he is the only Saint buried in the crypt Basilica of Echternach, Luxembourg. St. Willibrord connected with Christ and became "Apostle to the Frisians" (modern day Netherlands) and first bishop of Utrecht.

He was trained and ordained at a religious site located in the townland of Garryhundon, Co Carlow commonly referred to as Killogan, Rath Melsigi (Rathmelsh) or Clonmelsh. During the 7th and 8th centuries this site was the most important Anglo-Saxon ecclesiastical settlement in Ireland. From 678AD to c.720AD many Englishmen were trained for the continental mission. In 690AD Willibrord led a successful mission from Carlow, made up of Irishmen and Englishmen to the continent.

He was consecrated as a Bishop by Pope Sergius1 in Rome in 695AD. In 698AD he established his monastery in Echternach, said to be the oldest town in Luxembourg. As part of his abbey in Echternach, he established a scriptorium where they produced many of the bibles, psalms and prayer books that are to be found today in the great libraries of Europe. His signature is the oldest dateable signature in the English language and is written in a book that was probably written in Co. Carlow. This book is now housed in the Bibliotheque Nationale de France in Paris.

You can visit his tomb at the Basilica of Saint Willibrord, Echternach, Luxembourg, which was the homebase for his evangelization outreach. The motto written over his tomb is inspired by Isaish 12:3, "You will draw waters in joy from the fountains of the Savior." St. Willibrord shines "like the sun in the Kingdom" of the Father (Matthew 13:24-43). Attached to the Gibbon bulletin is a prayer card of St. Willibrord.
