BAPTISMS: Please make arrangements for attending a baptism session with Father Brendan anywhere from one to two months prior to the date of the baptism of a child.

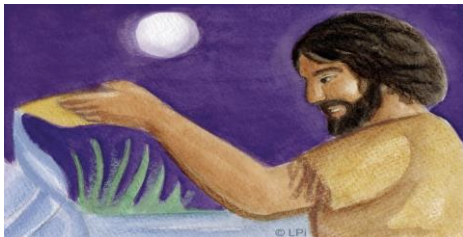

Reflection meditation:

So how do I listen to God and follow him? How can God help me make practical decisions? Mary and Joseph had to figure this out all the way up to the birth of Jesus. If you google this video by Fr. Mike Schmitz, "What's a Sign from God (and What Isn't)," he says: gather the data, weigh the options, talk to people, look at the risks, take responsibility, and make a decision. Mary did this when the angel Gabriel visited her in Matthew 1:1-25. Joseph did this when he took Mary into his home in Matthew 1:1-25. Mary and Joseph followed these steps and decided to travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem for the census even though Mary was ready to give birth. They accepted the risk. Mary and Joseph did this again when they decided to move from Bethlehem to Egypt. They trusted God with their relocation. Mary and Joseph did this again when they moved from Egypt to Nazareth. They made their home in Nazareth until Jesus was fully grown. This Christmas and New Year's you can also gather the data, weigh the options, talk to people, look at the risks, take responsibility, and make a decision.

YEAR-END GIVING

The end of the year is not far away, and it is time to start thinking of strategies to maximize the tax benefits of year-end giving. Federal tax laws and many state laws make it possible to reduce or eliminate taxes on gifts to charities like your parish, diocese, schools and other ministries. **At our parishes for example you could give to operational needs like the St. Andrew's tower repair project, St. Willibrord's HVAC project, St. Francis de Sales AC project.** Remember that only gifts made by December 31st can help reduce the amount of taxes you owe next April. Please consult your professional tax advisor for tax strategies for your personal situation.

A Charitable Remainder Trust is designed for individuals with highly appreciated assets like farm land or stock. Charitable Remainder Trusts (CRTs) offer donors extra tax advantages while allowing the donor to set the life income rate they would like to receive (generally 5% to 7%). As a donor, you can designate your parish to benefit from your gift after your lifetime. There are many variations of these trusts, and we work with Catholic charitable foundations that can walk you through various alternatives. These foundations also offer the expertise of attorneys who work with every day to insure competent investment advice. **A Charitable Gift Annuity (CGA)** provides an immediate tax deduction while providing a predictable stream of income during your life or other period of time you choose. You can name your parish to be the beneficiary of your CGA after your lifetime. For more information about Charitable Gift Annuities or Charitable Remainder Trusts, please contact the parish office at 507-426-7739.

Life Insurance

If you own life insurance policies that you no longer need, the cash value of these policies may be another source from which to make gifts to your parish, and they may result in significant state and/or federal estate tax savings.
