John the Baptist announced the coming of Jesus. He called for repentance and promised that the Messiah would baptize in the Holy Spirit. The start of God's kingdom must be marked by the end of every sort of evil. The spiritual combat must begin in the human heart. We must decide either for or against the kingdom of God. It should be a thorough break from the sinful life of the past. Now is the opportune time to seize it, to allow it to change things from bad to good. It is significant to note that John preaches the end of the reign of sin and the beginning of the reign of God, not just through fiery words but also by his own life. In him the messenger and the message blend perfectly well! In diet and attire, John lives a frugal life with no room for luxury, showiness and other unessential things. He lives radically under the gaze of divine providence. John's call for baptismal cleaning, fasting, repentance, conversion and upright living prepares the people to enter the messianic age.

"Lord Jesus, give me the grace to recognize my sin and repent."

The feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is this Tuesday, December 8th. It is the Patronal Feast Day of the United States and a holy day. Holy Mass will be 8:30 a.m. at St. Andrew, Fairfax.

The season of Advent has begun. In this Cycle B of lectionary readings, we hear primarily from the Gospel of Mark, which is structured around the question of who Jesus is. The Gospel of Mark is the oldest of the four gospels, and has an emphasis on the miracles of Jesus. Mark was a companion of Peter when he spent his last years in the city of Rome.

Advent is a perfect season to purify our hearts. When was the last time you went to confession? Two weeks, two years, twenty years, forty years? If much time has passed, do not lose another day. Go, the priest will be good. Jesus is there and Jesus is more compassionate than priests, Jesus receives you, he receives you with so much love. Be courageous and go to confession!

Know a Saint -Our Lady of Guadalupe (December 12)

Our Lady of Guadalupe came to offer faith, hope and consolation to the oppressed natives of Mexico and to reconcile them with their Spanish rulers. On December 9, 1531, Our Lady appeared to Juan Diego who was recently converted. She asked him to go to the Bishop and request that he build a church for her on the barren hill of Tepeyac which is now part of Mexico City. Our Lady wanted to show her merciful love to all of her children. The Bishop asked Juan to ask the

Lady for a sign. He did so and Our Lady promised to give him the sign. She then appeared to Juan Diego again and told him to pick the roses which miraculously grew there and bring them to the Bishop as a sign for him to believe her request. Juan gathered the roses in his coat and brought them to the Bishop. When the bishop opened the coat much to the astonishment of everyone the image of Our Lady appeared on it. The Bishop then built the church as she requested and ten million natives were converted and baptized to the one true faith within the next 10 years. Human sacrifice ended in Mexico. Our Lady of Guadalupe, which means crusher of the serpent's head, brought the light of the true faith, crushed the false gods of Mexico, and established an era of peace.

YEAR-END GIVING

The end of the year is not far away, and it is time to start thinking of strategies to maximize the tax benefits of year-end giving. Federal tax laws and many state laws make it possible to reduce or eliminate taxes on gifts to charities like your parish, diocese, schools and other ministries. Remember that only gifts made by December 31st can help reduce the amount of taxes you owe next April. Please consult **your professional tax advisor for tax strategies for your personal situation.**

Securities & Appreciated Assets

Gifts of stock, bonds, mutual funds, and certain other property that have increased in value can result in even greater tax savings than gifts of cash. If you have owned such investments for longer than one year you can generally donate them to your parish and deduct their full current value, even if it far exceeds your original cost.

Congress has provided that in addition to regular tax savings, you also do not have to pay capital gains tax when these assets are given to a qualifying charity. This "extra" tax savings is another reason why some choose to make their gifts this way.

You can also give assets to your parish that have decreased in value. You may receive a tax deduction of the incurred loss. The total amount of your loss and the charitable deduction may actually be more than the current value of the donated asset.

Dear Parishioners and Pastoral Leaders,

In 1988, the Catholic bishops of the United States launched the Retirement Fund for Religious to address the significant lack of retirement funding for Catholic sisters, brothers and priests in religious orders. This annual, parish-based appeal is coordinated by the National Religious Retirement Office and benefits some 30,000 senior Catholic sisters, brothers and religious-order priests whose communities lack adequate retirement funding.

Religious communities apply annually for financial support from the national collection, and distributions are sent to each eligible community's central house. Traditionally, Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests served for little or no pay. Today, hundreds of orders lack sufficient retirement savings. Last year, the appeal was able to distribute funds to 360 religious congregations across the country, who were able to use these funds to bolster retirement savings and subsidize expenses, such as prescription medications and nursing care. Roughly 94 percent of donations to the Retirement Fund for Religious directly aid senior religious; the remaining funds are used for promotional and administrative expenses.

In 2019, the people of the Diocese of New Ulm contributed \$25,979.15 to the Retirement Fund for Religious. This year, the Coronavirus has posed a particular difficulty and strain on the financial resources needed by many of our retired religious sisters, brothers, and priests. These men and women have given their lives to God in service of the Church. Let us take this collection as an opportunity to support these, our vulnerable brothers and sisters, and to say "thank you" for their witness and service by providing for their needs.

We will be taking up a collection in the Diocese of New Ulm for the Retirement Fund for Religious the weekend of December 12-13, 2020. Please join me in praying for all of our retired religious as well as for new vocations to the religious life.
