Perhaps we can relate in some small way to this Transfiguration experience. Perhaps there has been a time or two in our lives when we have had a spiritual experience, when we experienced God's healing, felt his mercy, or knew his presence was real. But then, maybe it went away. For most of us, we don't spend the majority of our time "on the mountaintop" with these "dazzling" sights into who God is. Rather, we tend to walk a journey that is shrouded by mystery and dependent upon faith. At times, we may even second-guess the spiritual experiences of our past once they have "disappeared." Possibly Peter, James and John wondered if it had all been a crazy illusion. But when the Resurrection happened, they knew it was for real. As we await the Resurrection this Lent, may we have the faith to believe that Jesus really has touched our lives and that he can lead us to eternal life.

"Lord Jesus, I am not worthy to receive you, but you will offer yourself to me. Help me to embrace you so that my soul may be healed."

Grow in love during Lent. The point of the season of Lent is to transform our hearts - to become new, ready to greet our new life at Easter. We can use this time in the desert to live lives of love for God and for one another.

Don't let this Lent pass by without the Sacrament of Reconciliation/Confession. The Lord's mercy is central to these 40 days of penance, prayer, and almsgiving. Times for individual confessions in our area faith community are...

THE LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINENCE REQUIREMENTS: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are obligatory for members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards and the norms on fasting from age 18 until age 59.

BREAKFAST TO BENEFIT MN FOODSHARE. The Social Concerns committee will be hosting a breakfast on Sunday, March 7, 2021 following the 8:30 am Mass at St. Francis. It will be a free will offering to benefit the foodshare in Sibley County. It is their 40th year and, in an effort to improve food insecurity in our area, they want you to know that your contribution is needed, food or money. The Minnesota Charitable Food System (food shelves, and food banks, meal programs, etc) have been running at full capacity. The Covid-19 pandemic has exacerbated this, making it critical to focus on creating a more just and equitable food system that meets the needs of all Minnesotans. Food insecurity means access to adequate food is inconsistent and limited by a lack of money and other resources throughout the year. Food insecure households report their diets to be of reduced quality, variety, or desirability and/or experience disrupted eating patterns and reduced food intake. The Charitable Food System wants to have nourishing food, regardless of race, socioeconomic class, location, gender and other social identities.

For the 2020 FoodShare drive, Sibley County collected 7,003 pounds of food and \$30,165. This is well below our neighboring counties of McLeod, Nicollet and Brown!
