Reflection meditation

There are people who are addicted to conflict. Sort of professional "shamers" who need controversy to feed on to feel alive. Psychologists say folks like this try to make the people around them feel bad, guilty, down, and ashamed as part of a power play. Healthy communication could solve things, but they thrive on stirring things up. Putting others down can also be a reflection of their own deeply felt need for validation. The sad thing is they are usually acting out of a core wound that can never be fixed by a power play, only by accepting Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. On Palm Sunday Christ leads us through his Passion which is loaded with "shamers" (Mark 14:1-15:47). Shame on the woman who anointed Jesus. The shamers were "indignant" and "infuriated." It was a "waste." But Jesus says, "she has anticipated anointing my body for burial." Judas, ashamed of Christ, is the first priest to betray the Lord. During the Last Supper Christ calls him out, but like most shamers, Judas is in denial and says, "Surely it is not I?" Ashamed of Christ's arrest in the garden, "[the apostles] all left him and fled." When the going gets tough the shamers get going. Have you ever seen bullies run when real work needs to be done? The Temple's high priest seeks to shame Jesus. Using faux facts and accusations, he brings Jesus before his kangaroo court and then explodes in anger. It's a big show. Have you ever seen someone blow up in anger trying to get what he or she wants? It is an intimidation tactic. Then, Christ is sent to the Roman Governor, Pontius Pilate, who questions him before the people who say, "Crucify him." Have you ever seen politicians mock our Christian religion or attempt to deny Christian citizens their own civil liberties and Constitutional rights? Christ stands his ground in the face of corrupt government. Then the Roman soldiers mock Jesus further. They clothe him in purple and crown him like a king but with thorns. It's a blood bath. Shamers are us sinners who like a good mess. This is what our sin turns into. A bloody mess. Just look at Peter who denies Christ three times after promising "I will never deny you." The Prophet Isaiah describes Christ's response to the shamers, the mockers, the professional chaos creators, aka the sinners and the mess. "I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting" (Isaiah 50:4-7). More than conflict we are all addicted to sin. But Christ "humbled himself" and dives into our personal mess to save us. He takes the fun out of disfunction and leads us to freedom. When the Roman Centurion sees all this happen, when he sees Christ breath his last to save us from the disfunction of sin, this non-believing well trained and high-ranking soldier says, "Truly this man was the Son of God." He sees Jesus Christ is full of integrity. Like the Centurion, don't be a shamer, be a Jesus praiser! As the crowds said at the first Palm Sunday, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord" (Mark 11:1-10).


