The Gospels of this weekend and next are powerful stories of forgiveness: the prodigal son and woman caught in adultery. In each, one a parable and the other an event in the life of Christ, we are presented with a cast of characters who deal with sin and forgiveness. And we can find ourselves in the place of any one of them at a particular time. **Sometimes we are the accuser, sometimes the sinner, sometimes the one who offers forgiveness.** In the complexity of our lives, it is likely that we are all three at one and the same time.

In today's parable, **Jesus invites us to see the relationship that binds people together,** despite the fracturing caused by sin. It is tough to forgive; just like the elder son. We are happy when God forgives us. Are we willing to be an occasion of such happiness for others?

I hope that everyone has a chance to **pray the Stations of the Cross during Lent.** Either together the multiple times scheduled in our parishes each Friday at 7 p.m. or by stopping into church and praying them on your own.

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are obligatory for members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards and the norms on fasting from age 18 until age 59.

MESSAGE FROM SISTER MARY ANN: I am writing to first of all thank all of you for the success of Pedal Past Poverty. This was the 10th year and our Sisters and employees were able to contribute \$33,000 to this event due to the generous donations from those who supported all of us for this event. So thank you to each of you who supported me with such generous contributions. I am truly touched by your gift of money and your desire to reach out to those without shelter. I also thank all of you who prayed for the success of this fund raiser. This year all participants pedaled for a total of about \$93,000. Needless to say that was a great total for the event. So thank you and may God continue to do great things in and through all of you.

Secondly, I ask for your prayers as our sisters will prepare for a future move that will take many of them to Shakopee. We have studied, prayed, and searched for options these past years that will address the ongoing needs of all our sisters (enhanced care, memory care, assisted and independent living).

The Benedictine facility in Shakopee seems to be our best option since it keeps most of our sisters in close proximity to one another and all levels of care are possible. We will also have around twenty sisters stay in the Mankato area and be a presence to the people there. I plan to be one of those sisters. Needless to say we are very sad we need to leave the Mankato area since we have been there since 1865. However, we trust and believe that God will continue to work in and through us as we form community and continue to live our lives as sisters in a new place and time. Just as all of you have known transitions in your lives, we too, take that ongoing journey. I ask for your prayer as we prepare for our move which may happen sometime in the fall.
