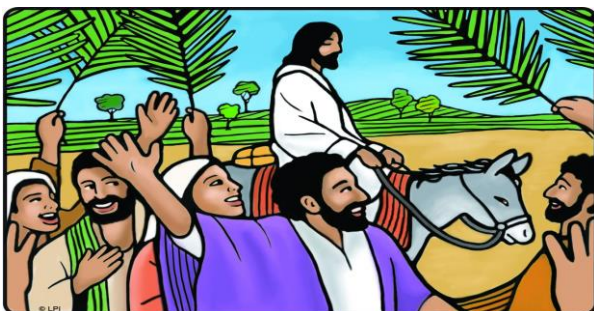

We have just listened to the narration most central to salvation history - of how **Jesus laid down his life for our redemption**. We may be quick to condemn many of the characters presented in the account. But think for a while; would we have acted differently if we were in a similar situation? Judas may be considered the most wicked in the story, but his love of money may not be totally absent in *my* life. Those who handed over Jesus to death were more concerned about their positions and privileges than justice and truth; I need to ask myself how often I have yielded to self-interest and opportunism than stood for justice and fairness. If the disciples fled the scene when the soldiers came for Jesus, I remember how carefully I have shunned risk-involving situations. If I did not deny Jesus as Peter did, I am sure I have avoided taking an evangelical stand on many issues that mattered. **Yes, I find myself doing the very things that I condemn in others.** But I have hope yet. It was to make amends for these and similar failures of mine that Jesus came. I surrender my 'sinful' self to him. It's something to keep in mind as we enter into this Holy Week.

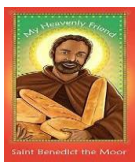

#### **KNOW A SAINT April 4 – St. Benedict the Moor**

St. Benedict was born a slave in Italy in 1526. He was freed by his master but then devoted his entire life to God. His hard work for the community and his reputation for holiness led him to positions of honor but he kept his focus on the true wisdom of all life. This was his love of God and his neighbor. He refused to allow his humble beginnings to keep him from his life's goal of holiness, miracles and generosity. He was a skillful counselor and many people came to seek his help. He is the Patron Saint of the Black Community in the United States.

#### **Liturgy Matters #22**

With the next exchange, the priest is already and entirely within his role as Christ at the head of his body. With a voice of authority, but a voice also filled with excitement and love for what is about to happen, he commands the people, "Lift up your hearts." In the Latin, *sursum corda* "this phrase is like a shout, literally, "Hearts on high!" It is Christ the head telling his body where we are going and we are going there fast. In response to this, the body answers its head and says, "We lift them up to the Lord: that is, we have our hearts where you told us to put them. In effect, this summons on high is a being brought into the all-at-once of Christ's Resurrection, into his hour, where past and future are both made present to us. We are obeying the apostle's injunction when he said, "Since you have been raised up in company with Christ, set your heart on what pertains to higher realms where Christ is seated at God's right hand. Be intent on things above rather than on things of earth" (Colossians 3:1-3). Once we have joined with Christ in the higher realm, he announces the purpose of our being there: "Let us give thanks to the Lord our God". The assembly immediately assents to the proposal: "It is right and just". In this response, we are thanking God for all the mighty deeds that God has ever worked for our salvation. Christ himself thanks the Father for his Resurrection, a thanksgiving which includes his joy that we can be made members of his risen body. And for this wondrous gift we, of course, also thank the Father together with him. Thanksgiving is what the Greek word Eucharist means. It is why we can call all that happens at Mass the Eucharist, the thanksgiving.

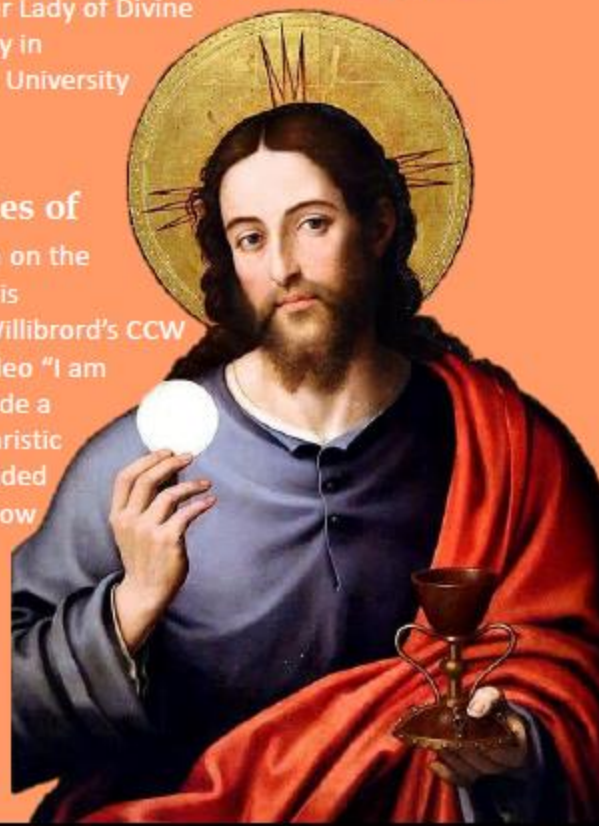
