#### Reflection for Sunday, April 28

It's almost the end of school and even more, graduation time. The word graduation comes from the Latin word, *gradus*, meaning "a step," or, "a step climbed." For each step you take, Jesus says in Matthew 25:21, "well done." Congratulations graduates on the many steps you have climbed. You climbed through grade school, middle school, and high school. You've taken steps to expand your skill sets in reading, writing, and arithmetic. In your extra-curricular activities you expanded your leadership abilities, friend groups, athletic achievements, and capacity to become a contributing member to society, Christian marriage and family, and the community. In faith, you've taken steps in your walk with Christ, from baptism to reconciliation to communion to confirmation. Well done! As a young adult, if you choose to keep taking steps in your relationship with Jesus Christ, you will join the top 20%. Twenty percent of young adults choose to follow Jesus Christ after graduation. **KNOW A SAINT May 2 – St. Wiborada** was born of a noble family in Switzerland. She nursed the sick and poor that her brother, a priest, would bring her. After their parents' death, she moved close to her brother and became a Benedictine nun. She made her brother's clothes and helped to bind many of the books in the monastery library. She became known for her extreme plainness and for her gift of prophecy. She attracted a following and in 925 she foresaw the

Hungarian invasion of her region. Her warning gave the priests and religious of St Gall and St Magnus time to hide the books and wine and escape into the caves. She was urged to flee as well but she refused. In 926 the Hungarian invasion reached St Gall. They burnt down the church and broke into the roof of Wiborada's cell. They split her skull with an axe as she knelt in prayer. She was the first woman to be formally canonized. In Switzerland she is the patron saint of libraries and librarians.


