Reflection for April 7

It is Divine Mercy Sunday. Part of showing mercy is letting go of what someone actually owes you. Mercy is what Matthew 6:14 means, "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you." When you are able to let go of (forgive) a hurt, injustice, wrong, breach of trust, or wound someone has caused you, you let go of something they owe you. You show mercy. Why do it? It's what God does for us. We call it Divine Mercy. There was a peasant girl, the third of ten children, in the country of Poland. Jesus appeared to her at her parish and gave her a message about his Divine Mercy (Głogowiec, Poland, around 1912). Few people believed her including her parents. She became a religious sister. Her superior struggled to believe her. She wrote down the words Jesus gave her (Google it at *Diary: Divine Mercy in My Soul.*). Jesus told her that he wanted an image of his Divine Mercy to be "solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter Sunday; that Sunday is to be the Feast of Mercy" (February 22, 1931). The priests and bishops reviewing her writings struggled to believe her. Imagine the hurt, rejection, and scorn she went through just trying to do what Jesus asked. Finally, a Pope, John Paul II, approved her writings at the Vatican (Canonization of St. Faustina, April 30, 2000). The message of Divine Mercy is a devotion by St. Faustina, but a gift to the entire world. Look up the Divine Mercy Chaplet! Say a prayer thanking Jesus for forgiving you and letting go of everything you owe him for your sins. Happy Divine Mercy Sunday!

KNOW A SAINT - April 7 – Saint George the Younger was born in Greece around 776 from a rich and religious family. At the age seventeen, he used his fortune to help the sick and poor and entered a monastery to dedicate his whole life to God. He was elected unanimously to be the bishop at the age of only twenty-seven. For nine years he was the pastor of this local Church, always persevering in his life of penance and charity. In 813 the harassment of the government forced him to go to Constantinople to defend the rights of the church. He stood up against Emperor Leo and was exiled to Ukraine. He died there and his remains were transferred to Mitylene where his tomb became a scene of miraculous healings. His life teaches us that in troubled times we must stand up for our beliefs and stand fast in our faith.
