In spite of the presence of numerous varieties of food that tickle our taste buds, they cannot satisfy our hunger forever and give us eternal life. Only Jesus Christ, the eternal food and drink, can satisfy our hunger and quench our thirst forever! Blessed Alexandrina Maria de Costa of Balazar, Portugal, fed on the Eucharist, for many, it is a lifeless piece of bread. Several Catholics around the world **disbelieve in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.** The Devil dreads the presence of the Eucharist and we who claim to be believers and **followers of Jesus end up desecrating the Eucharist by our sinful way of life.** St. Thomas Aquinas wrote the liturgy for Corpus Christi when Pope Urban IV added the Solemnity to the universal Church's liturgical calendar in 1264. We have learned from our earliest days as believers in the words of Jesus in today's Gospel: "My flesh is true food and my blood is true drink." When we come forward for communion, we eat Christ's body and drink his blood. We are united intimately to him and to one another.

"Man should tremble, the world should be deeply moved when the Son of God appears on the altar in the hands of the priest." ~St. Francis of Assisi

On Sunday, the Feast of Corpus Christi, Bishop Chad W. Zielinski invites the faithful from throughout the diocese to participate in a family-friendly Corpus Christi Eucharistic procession. The procession, led by Bishop Zielinski, will begin from the Diocesan Pastoral Center, 1421 6th Street North (overlooking the New Ulm Medical Center).

At 4 p.m., those gathered will process publicly as a group to the Cathedral of the Holy Trinity for a blessing and Benediction, followed by a barbecue in Washington Park, across from the Cathedral.

Shuttle Available - Parking will be available in the parking lot of the Cathedral of the Holy Trinity. Participants may choose to walk to the Diocesan Pastoral Center (one mile up a large hill), or take a shuttle from the Cathedral, available from 3-3:45 p.m.

The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is Friday, June 16. On this feast, Jesus addresses each of us: "Behold this Heart which has so loved you, yet is so little loved." When we consider the many proofs of his love, we can't help but love him in return.

Please earnestly pray for more vocations to the priesthood!

Liturgy Matters #32

Communion with one another is an essential part of God's plan; and having designed salvation with this shape, God surely is teaching us and causing us to participate in the tremendous regard He has for us, His tremendous love toward us. We are made of double communion. Saint Augustine expresses it with utter precision, when he says, "The true peace of rational creatures, which is the only peace of the heavenly city, consists in a perfectly

ordered and harmonious enjoyment of God and one another in God." Enjoyment of God and of one another in God—this enjoyment is already tasted in the Eucharistic feast. Another name for this is praise. There is also a technical term, based on Greek, which is doxology. A sense of doxology or praising and glorifying God has run through the Eucharistic prayer from the very start. In fact, in the preface and the angelic hymn the notion of doxology was very much to the fore, even if the term was not used yet. But there is a specific part of the Eucharistic prayer that is called the doxology, and it is this that closes the whole prayer. Doxology is this prayer's final thrust, come full circle from the doxology of the preface.

The bishop, or priest, lifts up the bread and wine—bread and wine which we have brought, bread and wine transformed into the body and blood of Christ in the form of his sacrifice which never passes away, bread and wine which we are shortly to consume—and lifting them up he presents them to God the Father as the "perfect offering made to the glory of His name." "Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever." In that moment the Church is doing what Christ did and forever does: she offers his one body, to which she has been joined, to the Father for the glory of His name and for the salvation of the world. This is our communion in the sacrifice of Christ. This is perfect praise.


