Mark 4:35-41 "Who then is this whom even the wind and sea obey?" What a sight to behold. **Could we ever doubt again that he was Lord of all creation after a moment like that?** Well...maybe. In retrospect, we too often second-guess such episodes of spiritual charity: In fact, it appears as though the disciples themselves were already struggling with forgetting the power of the signs they had previously seen. This is why Jesus reprimands them because of their fear, "**Do you not yet have faith?**" Why does Jesus expect them to have faith *already?* Because, as Mark's Gospel records for us, Jesus had *already* cured countless people, cast out demons for all to see, and even had a divine voice announce at his baptism, "**You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased**" (1:11). The miracles were not in short supply. Let's not fall prey to the same problem, thirsting for other miracles than the ones we have already experienced in our own lives. Let us join in maintaining an attitude of belief, as we thank the Lord for "his wondrous deeds to the children of men."

KNOW A SAINT Matt Talbot (June 19)

Matt Talbot was born in 1856 to a poor family with 12 children in Dublin, Ireland. Like his father and several of his brothers he was an alcoholic. When he was 28 years old Matt decided to stop drinking. It was a struggle so he turned to God for help. He began to go to daily Mass. He often spent his free time—the time he used to spend in the pub—praying. He became especially close to Mary. He knew that our Blessed Mother wanted to help him live a happy life. He read stories of the saints and joined the Third Order of St. Francis. Matt gave his wages away to friends who needed money for rent or to buy food or shoes for their children. He was also generous in donating money to his church. He stayed sober for the rest of his life—

almost 40 years. Hewas a man of simplicity. He was on his way to Mass when he died on a neighborhood street of a heart attack. Matt was healed from his addiction by God's love and his faith. Like Matt, we can bring our troubles to God and Mary in prayer. We can remember that God hears and answers all of our prayers. Today, many men and women who struggle with alcohol addiction carry with them a "Matt Talbot", medal with Talbot's likeness on it, to help them in their struggle.
