In the Gospel today Jesus promises to ask the Father to give his disciples an Advocate to be with us always. That Advocate, **the Holy Spirit, dwells in our hearts and unites us to Christ and to one another through our communion of love.** Because of baptism, through which the Spirit enters in, Christians everywhere are united in Christ. This union in Christ, brought about by the Holy Spirit, empowers the Christian people to be effective witnesses to Christ's love in the world. What witness can you give that testifies to the action of the Holy Spirit in your life?

Today we celebrate **the feast of Pentecost, one of the most ancient feasts of the Church.** Before the first Pentecost (which came a few weeks after the death and resurrection of Jesus), there were followers of Jesus, but no movement that could be called “the church.” So, from a historical point of view, Pentecost is the day on which the Church was started. It is also true from a spiritual perspective, since the Spirit brings the Church into existence and enlivens it. That is why this feast is often called “the birthday of the Church.”

TAKING CHRIST INTO THE STREETS OF NEW ULM: CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION All are invited to a Diocesan Corpus Christi Procession at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 19 in NewUlm for the great feast of Corpus Christi. The procession will begin at the Diocesan Pastoral Center and will conclude with Benediction at the Cathedral of the Holy Trinity. Eucharistic adoration will take place beginning at 3 p.m. in the Pastoral Center Chapel. Busing will be available from the Cathedral parking lot from 3-3:45 p.m. **Please park at the Cathedral.** Come early to walk and pray the beautiful Stations of the Cross that begin down the hill from the Pastoral Center behind the hospital. A barbeque picnic will follow in Washington Park across the street from the Cathedral. This begins the three-year National Eucharistic Revival. It is also Fathers' Day, so bring the whole family to honor our earthly fathers and especially the One who has come to lead us to the Father!
