The story of the good Samaritan has become one of the favorites for Christians over the years. You only have to look at the classical painted, stained-glass windows, or prints in family Bibles to see how often the parable is illustrated.

If you were in trouble, how would you react if the person who came to help you was an illegal immigrant, or the member of an ethnic group that you may have recently disparaged? So, who is your neighbor?

"Be one of the small numbers who find the way to life, and enter by the narrow gate into heaven. Take care not to follow the majority and the common herd, so many of whom are lost. Do not be deceived; there are only two roads: one that leads to life and is narrow; the other that leads to death and is wide.

There is no middle way." ~St. Louis de Montfort

Throughout the Catholic Church, the month of July is dedicated to the *Most Precious Blood of Jesus*. The feast day (celebrated July 1) was instituted in 1849 by Pious IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ and the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood. Many saints had a devotion to the Precious Blood of Jesus, most notably St. Catherine of Sienna, St. John Chrysostom and St. Gertrude.

The Feast of **Saint Benedict** is Monday, July 11. St. Benedict, the twin brother of St. Scholastica was born in Nursia, Italy and began his monastic life at age 16. Many disciples were drawn to him observing his sanctity, miracles, and his gift for directing souls. Benedict founded and became the abbot of Monte Cassino and organized his companions into one monastic community. His monks vested manual labor with a new dignity that comes only with prayer. Benedict's life and works profoundly affected the spirituality and life of the Church and Western civilization. Benedict was canonized in 1220. The Catholic Church venerates him as Patron of Europe.

I entered the Benedictine Monastery in Bangalore, India and professed my First Vows 26 years ago.
