The rivalry of **Mary and Martha** described in St. Luke's Gospel has played out in a variety of ways over the centuries. **The story is often cited as revealing of the tension between the active and contemplative life in the church.** But there is more at work in the Gospel than a first glance might suggest. Hospitality is one of the great social traditions in the Middle East. Jesus is in some ways overturning that custom, inviting us to not only consider what we do for someone, but also what the other person offers to us. God gives us a job to do, and it is ours to accomplish. When we meet a beggar, what does he teach us?

"It is not fitting, when one is in God's service, to have a gloomy face or a chilling look." ~St. Francis of Assisi

This past Tuesday it was announced that the New Ulm Diocese is receiving a new Bishop. It has been almost two years since Bishop LeVoir retired. Bishop Chad W. Zielinski, 57, grew up on a farm in rural Michigan, is a US Air Force veteran, served as a priest in the Diocese of Gaylord, Michigan, served as a chaplain in the US Air Force, and since 2014 he has served as the Bishop of Fairbanks, Alaska. Our new bishop will be installed as the fifth Bishop of the Diocese of New Ulm on Tuesday, September 27. Please pray for this time of transition for Bishop Zielinski.

The **beatification of Pope John Paul I has been set for September 4 at the Vatican**. Pope John Paul I was born in a small Italian mountain town and, along with his two brothers and one sister, lived in poverty. He was a humble man, and his surprise election after the death of Pope Paul VI did not change his humble way of living. His papacy was one of the shortest in history (33 days). He is remembered as the "smiling pope" and left a lasting impression on the Church. It is notable that Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI issued a face-to-face testimony about Pope John Paul I, the first Pontiff in history ever to do so.

GIVE THANKS AND REMEMBER! The following was written by the late Fr. Angelus Shaughnessy:

"We need the Holy Family. We need the family HOLY. Nothing in this world can make the family more holy than the Holy Eucharist: Holy Mass, at least every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation until the day you die, hopefully receiving Holy Viaticum at the end, our food for our trip into eternity. When you receive Jesus in Holy Communion, try to make a proper thanksgiving afterwards...That time after Holy Communion is the most precious in your entire day, the most precious in your entire life. You and I will not get closer to God this side of Heaven. After Holy Communion, we have equivalently what the Virgin Mother of God had when She conceived Christ nine months before His birth at the time of His enfleshment. Jesus was within Mary's womb. With you and me in Holy

Communion, He is right within our body. If you ever want something from God (and who of us doesn't?), Holy Communion is the best time to ask for it; because, when we pray, we dispose our own hearts to receive. And what better timing for that than when the Sacred Eucharistic Heart of Jesus is resting, is living, is beating right within our own hearts. When Pope John Paul II was offering Holy Mass in his private chapel, he would sit down right after Holy Communion for 10 minutes to make his thanksgiving before the dismissal of the people. "Strive for this holiness without which no man can please God." [Hebrews, 12:14] What better time and place to give thanks and remember to be, to become all that our God wants us to be, to become?

PRAYER FOR RAIN & BLESSINGS ON OUR CROPS

Remember us, O God; From age to age be our comforter. You have given us the wonders of our world, blessings in day and night, seasons and years, and through the beauty of nature.
