“So they said to him, ‘**What can we do to accomplish the works of God?**’ Jesus answered and said to them, ‘This is the work of God, that you believe in the One he sent.’” These bewildered believers came to Jesus seeking direction. They had witnessed his miracles, heard his teachings, and been miraculously fed by his hands. Now *they* wanted to know what they should do. How should they respond to the revelations they were witnessing? Jesus gives a surprising answer. Instead of focusing on external tasks, he tells the crowd that God’s work is to believe in him. This, apparently, is the appropriate starting point for doing God’s work. Feeding the hungry is always good, but feeding the hungry as an expression of our love for Jesus is going to enable us to feed them with more compassion, more generosity, and more long-term commitment. **When faith in Jesus is foremost in our lives, then the other important tasks that are all part of God’s work will fall into place.** So let us examine the good works that we do and be sure that they have as their starting point a deep and abiding faith in the Son of God.
