Reflection meditation:

The storms of life cause us fear. As Britain was being bombed by enemy aircraft during World War II, fear plagued the people. Winston Churchill addressed the nation reminding them, "Fear is a reaction. Courage is a decision." Every one of us faces a battle in everyday life, not just war times. In 1 Kings 19:11-13, Elijah faces his fears, but God appears in a whisper. In Matthew 14:22-33, Peter faces great fear, but Jesus helps him walk on water. "Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, "O man of little faith, why did you doubt?" What battles are you facing? What fears plaque you? Do you ever fail to live your dreams because you are living out your fears?

Jesus says, "Take courage, it is I, do not be afraid" (Matthew 22:14-33). The Old and New Testament Scriptures say, "do not be afraid" at least 365 times. That's one time for every day of the year. Why? Jesus Christ is the answer to overcoming our fear and living in freedom. Fear is a prison and type of slavery. Psychologists who study fear talk about the effect of fear on a person. It causes the brain to stop thinking. A person experiences "fight or flight" instincts. Unhealthy coping mechanisms kick into action and we often experience temptations toward the seven deadly sins – lust, gluttony, greed, sloth (laziness), anger, envy, and pride. These pave the path to prison. When we follow Christ, he builds a bridge to freedom.

One of my favorite motivational speakers Zig Ziglar says this, "Fear has two meanings: 'Forget everything and run," or, "face everything and rise.' The choice is yours." If you listen to Christ and "take courage" he will help you rise to the occasion when fear grips you. How? Find one or two passages from Scripture. Memorize them and when fear tries to grab hold of you, when a storm comes along, replace it with the Word of God. One is from Philippians 4:13, "I can do all things through him who strengthens me." Jesus says, "Take courage, it is I, do not be afraid" (Matthew 22:14-33).

To increase the Word of God in your life, I encourage you to pick up the FREE resource, Word Among Us, at the entrance to church. It contains the daily Scripture. Studying and praying with God's Eternal Word can help overcome fear!
