Reflection meditation:

It is Fun Fest and we celebrate St. Andrew Catholic Church and Andrew our Patron Saint. One of the twelve Apostles, St. Andrew was the first Apostle to follow Jesus (Matthew 4:18). St. Andrew can teach us about a relationship with Jesus Christ. 1) To follow God when he calls us. On the beach, Jesus says "follow me" (Matthew 4:18-22 and Mark 1:16-18). Andrew is generous with God. He sets down what he is doing and follows Jesus. 2) To learn how to share Christ with family and friends. After he connects with Jesus, Andrew finds his brother, Peter, and invites him to meet and follow Christ (John 1:40-43). We need to learn how to share Jesus with family and friends. It is a skill. Mandates and dictates do not work. Invitations do. To propose the faith, not impose the faith is the approach St. Andrew can help us learn. 3) To be realistic. In John 6:8-9, Andrew asks Jesus what good will five loaves and two fish be to feed the five thousand. But, Andrew trusts that God could be generous even with minimal resources. Do I have the trust of St. Andrew?

Following Jesus' final commandment, "make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19), St. Andrew leaves Israel and travels to modern day Greece where the government arrests him for his Catholic faith. As the time for his martyrdom arrives, he does not feel worthy to be crucified on a cross the same as Jesus, so his persecutors crucify him on an X shape cross. The X shaped cross, now internationally known as the "Saint Andrew Cross," is used on statues, flags, and heraldry around the world. At any given moment you can walk into our own St. Andrew's Catholic Church to look at the top of the high altar and see the statue of St. Andrew holding an X shape cross. At Fun Fest you will see flags with the same X shaped cross on them to honor the patron saint of Fun Fest, St. Andrew!

Like the Canaanite woman in our Gospel (Matthew 15:21-28), St. Andrew knew that following in the footsteps of Jesus would be challenging. Like her, he shows great faith in Christ. We can do the same. When we set aside our activities and go to Sunday Mass, we connect with and follow Christ. When we learn how to share God moments and God winks with family and friends, we are proposing the faith to them. When we make realistic decisions that give God a chance to be generous, we show our trust in Christ. We each face crosses in everyday life. But when we pick them up, we do what St. Andrew did. May St. Andrew's Cross bless you this Fun Fest.
