Reflection meditation:

Do you trust that heaven is beautiful? Michelle Oswald, a fellow parishioner from Saint Francis de Sales, tells the story of a friend in the Diocese of New Ulm who had a near death experience. After the medical team revived the man, he simply said, "heaven is beautiful," Jesus frequently talks about heaven in the Scriptures. Heaven is a "house with many rooms" (John 14:2), a place prepared for you (John 14:3), a paradise (Luke 23:43). In Matthew 16:13-20, Jesus tells St. Peter, our first pope, "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven." When we practice our Catholic faith we are following Jesus, the Son of God, who founded the Catholic Church in order to guide us to heaven through the Sacraments, Scripture, Sacred Tradition and the Popes and Bishops. This week has been hot; hell is hotter, but heaven is beautiful.
