Jesus foretells his suffering, passion and death. All those who wish to follow Jesus must take up their cross.

We don't like to hear difficult things. Certainly, Peter and the disciples didn't want to hear from Jesus that he was going to go to Jerusalem where he would suffer and be killed. It is in that context that Jesus tells his disciples that his own death is a mirror for what must happen in their lives. Each person must take up the cross and follow. What that means in daily life for each will be different since our cross is our own. But accepting it and carrying it is what it means to follow Christ.

"Lord Jesus, I don't want to keep you at a distance. Teach me how to give of myself as you did."

Lean on our Faith during tough times. Practice listening during prayer. Even though our schedules may have slowed down our thoughts probably have not. Make mental space to listen to and hear from the Holy Spirit and allow Him to bring truth and consolation.

Parishes need your continued support. We are committed to serving you in the midst of this pandemic while supporting staff and operational needs. KNOW A SAINT St. Augustine (August 28)



St. Augustine was the son of an officiant of the Roman Empire and at 16 his parents sent him away to the university at Carthage. Soon after leaving for school St. Augustine's father died. After his father's death he took to a life of partying and sin. At 32 he experienced a spiritual awakening that would lead him to renounce his life of sin and partying to dedicate his life to God. For the rest of his life St. Augustine committed to live a life of poverty. Ultimately he became a bishop for the church and wrote over 800 sermons and letters on religious topics of the time. His miraculous conversion is shared as an inspiration to those who are struggling with a vice or a habit they are trying to break. His mother was St. Monica.

2020 INDIA WELL WATER PROJECT: This 2020 year has given us many unexpected challenges! Because of not being able to gather for Mass and for social events and have fundraisers, our All Saints AFC Well Project with Fr. Stephen at the Benedictine Monastery in Sivagangai, India had to be put aside for a few months. Thank you to any who have given donations during the pandemic; it is much appreciated! Now that we are able to be somewhat back together, and have some social gatherings, we hope that we can again try to reach our goal to reduce, or even eliminate, the \$20,000 loan the monastery has borrowed to pay for the well. The well has given the local people in the village a renewed water supply, and supplies water for the irrigation of the crops. The local people are very dependent on the crops they grow to provide a living for their families. Having the well totally paid for will allow the monastery to use their funds to help the local people in a variety of other ways. Through prayer and heartfelt consideration, we hope you will be able to give a generous donation! 100 % of the money donated to the Well Project will go to pay down the Well Project bank loan.
