Reflection Question for the Transfiguration of the Lord

Which self-interest of mine will I promise to put aside and what cross will I pledge to carry, transfiguring my life and my little part of the world?

Reflection meditation:

Always wanting to be the first to report breaking news, journalists like getting eyewitness interviews. We remember that the Gospels are eyewitness accounts of what Jesus Christ did and said. Saint Peter says this in his letter, 2 Peter 1:16-19, "We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven while we were with him on the holy mountain." "This is my Son, my beloved, with whom I am well pleased." The holy mountain, is the mountain of Transfiguration, where Jesus climbs with Peter, James and John as reported in Matthew 17:1-9. They **connect**, **follow** and later learn to **share** Jesus. On the mountain-top they see Jesus transfigured before them. (Google map- "Church of Transfiguration, Israel" to see pictures of the views there or read more on Wikipedia.) The philosopher and theologian, St. Thomas Aquinas, points out that the words the Apostles use in Scripture to describe what they see happening to Jesus in this event means they see light shining from Jesus himself.

Jesus is changed. Jesus shows the Apostles what he will look like in heaven. Jesus personally changes the lives of all three. Like them, the patron saints of our three parishes were transfigured or changed by their encounters with Jesus. They connect with Christ, chose to follow Christ, and learn how to shared Christ with family and friends. Let's look at the **connect, follow, share** pattern for St. Andrew, St. Willibrord, and St. Francis de Sales.

The first disciple of Jesus, St. Andrew, connects with Christ on the beach of Galilee. He brings his brother Peter into a relationship with Christ, the Messiah (John 1:40-42). By following Christ he becomes an Apostle. While evangelizing in the area of modern-day Patras, Greece, St. Andrew is arrested by the Roman Empire (around 60-70 AD) and crucified on an X shape cross for his effort to share his faith in Jesus. You can visit his relics/remains at the Cathedral of Saint Andrew, Patras, Greece and at the Cathedral of St. Andrew, in Amalfi, Italy. St. Andrew shines "like the sun in the kingdom" of the Father (Matthew 13:24-43). Google these cathedrals to see their beauty. St. Andrew's feast day is November 30.

St. Willibrord, lived from around 658 AD to 739 AD. He connected with Christ and became "Apostle to the Frisians" (modern day Netherlands) and first bishop of Utrecht. You can visit his tomb at the Basilica of Saint Willibrord, Echternach, Luxembourg, which was the homebase for his evangelization outreach. The motto written over his tomb is inspired by Isaiah 12:3, "You will draw waters in joy from the fountains of the Savior." His feast day is November 7. St. Willibrord shines "like the sun in the kingdom" of the Father (Matthew 13:24-43).

St. Francis de Sales lived between 1567-1622 and wrote, "it is not those who commit the least faults who are the most holy, but those who have the greatest courage, the greatest generosity, the greatest love, who make the boldest efforts to overcome themselves, and are not immediately apprehensive about tripping." He shines "like the sun in the kingdom" of the Father (Matthew 13:24-43). **Bishop of beautiful Geneva, Switzerland**, he is buried in the Basilica of the Visitation in Annecy, France. Patron saint of journalists, his feast day is January 24. St. Francis de Sales shines "like the sun in the kingdom" of the Father (Matthew 13:24-43).

Like the patron saints of our parishes, may we be transfigured by a relationship with Christ. May we **connect**, **follow** and **share** Jessus.
