Reflection meditation:

There's talk about loan forgiveness. We may be told about a forgiveness period with no fines or penalties. What is forgiveness? One definition is this. To freely let go of what someone owes you. Banks do this. Loan agencies do this. Institutions with registration requirements do this. It's clear there are times we need forgiveness. But, let go of what someone owes me? They owe it! Yup. That's why Jesus' teaching in Matthew 18:21-35 is so challenging. In the parable the king forgives the debt of his servant, but that servant refuses to forgive the debt of someone who owes him. It's hard to forgive. Like him, you and I might say, "But, so and so owes me." When we say that, we are correct. Something is owed. If someone "owes you" what can you do? First, stop and remember the gentle hand of God. He is the king in this Scripture and he is willing to forgive every sin, transgression, injustice, hateful thing you have ever done to him. Remember the sacrifice of Jesus, who offered himself on the Cross to cover the cost of every sin, transgression, injustice and hateful thing you and I have ever committed against God and our neighbor. Second, ask yourself, if God did that for me, "Can I see my way to doing that for my neighbor?" Forgiveness can be more painful the deeper your hurt goes. It can feel like a double injustice – first so and so hurt me, and now Jesus is asking me to let go of what is owed me? Like salt on a wound, the pain can feel like it happens twice. Why is it worth forgiving? Because God has forgiven "your entire debt."

It's back to school for All Saints AFC religious education (RE).

Thank you to all who attended the parent input meeting held in Gibbon on August 16, 2023, or offered other input. We learned a lot. You gave staff and volunteer teachers the opportunity to process what you think is working and not working. More-than-ever, parents face busy schedules with school, sports, extracurricular activities, and family gatherings. We want you to be successful in these! Here are options and updates for 2023-24 All Saints AFC religious education:

- All Saints AFC religious education (RE) will continue to be offered in two locations for the 2023-24 year at St. Willibrord in Gibbon and St. Andrew in Fairfax.
- Parents from any town can choose from one of the two locations. You can indicate the location you want for your family when you register online.
- All grade levels will move to the same start and end time, 7pm -8pm, on Wednesday nights. In the Gibbon location, parents will be able to drop children off starting at 6:30pm for pre-class games, food and fellowship.
- First Communion Class Classes will be taught at both locations, 7-8pm, Wednesdays, in Gibbon and Fairfax. Parents will be able to celebrate a child's first communion in their home parish.
- Confirmation Class This year confirmation class will be combined & held in one location. Many students are already friends from school. Class will be 7-8pm, Wednesdays, at the Gibbon location.
- Getting to one town or the other, even with the better roads, may still be challenging. Some families have overcome this by car-pooling.
- Change: Instead of the originally scheduled beginning Mass, parents are asked to accompany their child to his or her class for to "meet the teacher," confirm your emergency contact phone number, tour the teaching space, and meet and greet other parents in the social area. This first class is Wed, Sept 20 at 7pm in Fairfax and Gibbon.
