Reflection meditation:

C. S. Lewis wrote a fictional book about people taking a bus ride to heaven. The people don't realize they are deceased. As the passengers get off the bus in heaven, one passenger is confused to meet a man he knew on earth who was a murderer. Named Len, the murderer, explains that he repented. Len tells the new arrival, no one gets what they deserve, you get something better when you follow God. The murderer, Len, then encourages the bus passenger to come towards heaven, to seek happiness. Does the bus passenger want to be happy? Any of us could be the bus passenger, debating if we want or deserve to be happy. God wants you to be happy. In Matthew 20:1-16, Jesus asks, "Are you envious because I am generous?" You might ask yourself, "Am I surprised God wants to be generous with me and my neighbor?" Let God be generous with you and your neighbor this week. (The book about the bus ride to heaven by C. S. Lewis is called *The Great Divorce*.)


