Reflection meditation:

An article, "Brain Anatomy and How the Brain Works," by Johns Hopkins Medicine says much of your decision-making takes place in the largest lobe of the human brain, the frontal lobe. Psychologists who study prayer will say the frontal lobe is also the part of the brain that "lights up" when you pray. In Romans 12:1-2 Saint Paul writes, "be transformed by the renewal of your mind." Why does our mind need renewal? We each undoubtedly have made good decisions and bad ones, smart choices and mistakes, beneficial comments and unhelpful ones, accurate calculations and miscalculations. "Why can't I just be right all the time?" we might ask. One of the effects of sin, of the fall of Adam and Eve is a corruption of our thought process. We are living proof of it. God knows that you need a renewal of the way you think. Need proof? How many times a day do you think negatively of yourself? How many times a day to do you think "I am a son or daughter of the living God?"

One of the greatest truths you can think on is how your baptism is an adoption into the family of God. On five occasions, Saint Paul teaches, Christians receive the Spirit of adoption, read: Romans 8:15, 23; 9:4; Galatians 4:5; and Ephesians 1:5. You are son or daughter of the living God. Replace your bad thoughts with that thought this week and let your mind be renewed by Jesus Christ.
