"He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears and spitting, touched his tongue." Jesus could have touched this deaf man another way. But instead, Jesus chose to heal him in this unique way. Clearly, this was not for Jesus' sake. And since it was away from the crowd, it wasn't for their sake either. This particular healing was for this particular man. Jesus knows what we need. His care for each and every one of us is not some standardized package of generis charity. He loves us all as unique individuals and understand us. He sees our weaknesses and knows our strengths. When we come to him with our hopes, our fears, our desires, and our needs, he hears and answers us...in the way he knows is best. It might be unexpected or different from what we have seen him do for others. But we need to trust that Jesus does care, that he does listen, and that he does act on our behalf.

AS WE BEGIN ONCE AGAIN TO OFFER THE SIGN OF PEACE in our parishes, it is important to remember that this is not a social act of extending greetings, congratulations, or condolences. It is a sacred ritual gesture by which the faithful symbolically offer to one another the peace of Christ that flows from His sacrifice made present on the altar. Because of this, the Church directs that it should be carried out in a "sober manner...only to those who are nearest" (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, 82). The exchange of peace must not be carried out in such a way that it distracts from the holiness of this point in the Mass. Rather, it should be in accord with the spirit of recollection that is fitting for this sacred moment between the offering of the Eucharist Prayer and the reception of Christ in Holy Communion.
